Why yes, we DO have books on Evangelism in the library! Here are some we think you'll find engaging and encouraging.

The **Art of Neighboring** by Jay Pathak and Dave Runyon (two local Denverites!) is an excellent book to make you think about how you use your home and the neighbourhood you live in to spread the love of Christ in your city. Evangelism isn't first of all about leading others to God, it's first and foremost about being a salt and light and showing others the love of Christ. This book has many good ideas and lots of good encouragement to do just that. An excellent and easy read, recommended for anyone.



The Secret Thoughts of an Unlikely Convert, **Openness Unhindered**, and **The Gospel Comes with a House Key** are three fantastic books by Rosaria Butterfield on the topic of hospitality and outreach. The first is the author's own story of how she came out of a life of darkness through the hospitality of a Christian pastor who spoke the truth to her in love. The second is more of an academic work, addressing the topic of sexual identity and what it means in the context of union with Christ. The third is an excellent read, calling all Christians to open their homes to their neighbors and people God puts in your lives, not being afraid to rub shoulders with brokenness and hurt. All three are fantastic reads, with the second being a little harder to read through, but definitely worth the effort. Start with the first, work through the second, and then savor the third. Highly recommended for anyone.
